An introduction to the natural history of southern Morocco.

Based for the week at the wonderful Atlas Kasbah in **southern Morocco**, our holiday is an excellent introduction to the flora, fauna and culture of this fascinating country. The short flight to Agadir, 30 minute transfer to the hotel and relaxed pace of the week make this trip ideal for anyone wanting a taste of Morocco in the company of expert leaders whilst enjoying a high standard of accommodation and **easy, comfortable travel**.

With Mediterranean, Macaronesian and African influences, this area has a **fascinating mix of plants** including succulent euphorbias, colourful composites, toadflaxes and lavenders and interesting shrubs, including the endemic Argan tree. The birdlife is very interesting and we should see most of the local specialties, including House Bunting, Moussier's Redstart, Black-crowned Tchagra and, with luck, the critically endangered **Northern Bald Ibis**. We will visit the Sous Massa National Park, where as well as a variety of birds, we will also look for several species of antelope that have been reintroduced here, including Addax, Dorcas Gazelle and the graceful Scimitar-horned Oryx.

Our traditionally and sustainably-built and run hotel, the Atlas Kasbah, has spacious rooms with lovely views of the surrounding countryside, attractive patios and a swimming pool. It is situated within the protected argan forest and we will have time to enjoy this area and grounds of the hotel as well as excursions to the coast, mountains, oases, small villages and the attractive town of Taroudant, a 'mini Marrakech', to experience the local **Berber culture**.

ITINERARY

Please note that the itinerary may be changed to suit the weather or other practicalities or at the discretion of the leaders.

Day 1 Thu 21st Our early flight takes us to Agadir, from where we transfer (c30 mins) to the Atlas Kasbah, in the hills out beyond the city.

After settling in, and our first delicious Moroccan lunch, we will have a gentle wander through the lanes and hillsides around the hotel . We walk from the hotel through the **Argan woodland** and discover why the tree is so valuable. The oval fruits sustain the local community and there is an increasing commercial activity selling the sweet rich oil – not too dissimilar to olive oil and widely used in Moroccan cooking. Colourful annuals can be a feature along field edges and include local specialities such as the orange-flowered *Cladanthus arabicus*, the pretty blue *Volutaria crupinoides* and the bugloss *Echium horridum*.

The local birdlife includes local specialities including Common Bulbul, House Bunting and Moussier's Redstart, species we will become familiar with during the week, while Black-crowned Tchagra and Barbary Partridge are also present, if somewhat shy.

Day 2 Fri 22nd The Atlantic coast south to the Sahara is well known for its unique communities of succulents *Euphorbia officinarum*, *E. regis-jubae* and *Kleinia anteuphorbia* mixed with shrubs such as *Nauplius imbricatus*, *Searsia pentaphylla* and the desert-dwelling *Warionia saharae*. We will visit **Cap Rhir** to explore these communities. Tristram's Warbler is known to winter in the coastal scrub, while the little-known Plain Swift is a possibility along this coastline. Nearby is the wetland of Oued Tamri, where we hope to see the critically endangered **Northern Bald Ibis**: the total world population is only around 400 birds, with one of the main nesting colonies nearby.

We will end the day with a visit to the old Kasbah of Agadir, with its views over the city.

Day 3 Sat 23rd Today we visit the attractive town of **Taroudant**, described as a 'mini Marrakech' but with a character of its own reflecting its rich Berber culture. We will enjoy views from ancient city walls and explore the labyrinthine market - full of spices and herbs and traditional furnishings such as rugs and teapots, House Buntings singing from the buildings and Little Swift overhead. We also visit a women's **Argan oil co-operative** and visit the oasis at Tioute, the natural habitat of the date palm *Phoenix dactylifera*.

Day 4 Sun 24th Today we will have a free day, with the opportunity to explore the local countryside a bit more, relax around the hotel or enjoy the pool (if the weather permits!).

In the afternoon, we will have the opportunity to immerse ourselves in Berber culture in the company of Helene, Hassan and the wonderful staff of the Atlas Kasbah, culminating in a celebratory meal.



Day 5 Mon 25th We head south along the coast to the famous **Sous Massa National Park**. Today we will learn about the important conservation work going on here, especially the reintroduction of a variety of **Saharan 'megafauna'** to the reserve; antelopes including Dorcas Gazelle, Scimitar-horned Oryx and Addax, and the North African Ostrich, all of which have become almost extinct across much of their range due to overhunting. We will have a visit in a convoy of very comfortable four-wheel-drive vehicles to the area where these animals have been reintroduced.

We will finish our day by visiting the Oued Sous, where Greater Flamingos gather on the estuary and feed alongside various waders, gulls and terns.

Day 6 Tue 26th This morning we head south to the **Anti Atlas**, a low range of very old mountains, which form much of the landscape in the south east of the country. We will travel to Ait Baha and beyond, with stunning views and interesting plants along the way: local endemic specialities include the toadflax *Linaria ventricosa* and *Hesperolaburnum platycarpum*. Barbary Ground Squirrel and the large lizard Bibron's Agama may appear along the roadside, while Bonelli's Eagle soar overhead.

Day 7 Wed 27th Today we head in the opposite direction, for the slopes of the **High Atlas**, making a circuit via the aptly-named Paradise Valley and the Cascades du Immouzer. We will find the Berber Thuya *Tetraclinis articulata*, an interesting conifer, as well as hillsides covered in Dwarf Fan Palm mixed in with *Lavandula dentata* and the beautiful shrubby milkwort, *Polygala balansae*, with contrasting petals of purple and yellow.

Day 8 Thu 28th Alas our week is up, and we bid farewell to the Atlas Kasbah and return to Agadir for our flight back to UK.

Accommodation, meals and transport

We will stay for the whole week at the wonderful **Atlas Kasbah**, a new hotel in a traditional design situated amongst the Argan trees in the Arganeraie Biosphere Reserve. The rooms are very spacious, the local culture reflected in the furnishings, and there are lovely views from the rooms and roof terrace. It has an attractive patio, gardens and swimming pool. It has been designed sustainably and is run in an environmentally friendly way. All food is included.

We will travel by minibus for our excursions. Our visit to Sous Massa will be in high clearance 4WD vehicles.

Health and fitness

Please see the General Information leaflet for health and fitness requirements. This is not a strenuous holiday but on some days we will be walking for much of the day, sometimes gently uphill. We will adapt our walking to the weather but we will no doubt be walking in the sun on some days, albeit not for very long walks. All excursions are optional and you can choose to spend more time in the pleasant grounds and rooms of the hotel if you wish. The hotel rooms are on the first or second floor and reached by stairs.



Leaders

Philip Precey is a Director of Wildlife Travel and has led many of our trips in recent years, including co-leading six of our visits to Morocco since 2013. Never far from his binoculars, Philip will help you to enjoy all aspects of the wildlife we encounter.

Laurie Jackson is an all round naturalist who has led several Wildlife Travel holidays, from Crete and Bulgaria to Svalbard and the Isles of Scilly.

We will be accompanied by Mohammed Belfakir, our local **Moroccan guide**, together with the assistance of Hassan and Helene, the owners of the Atlas Kasbah.

Weather

At this time of year the weather is usually sunny but not too hot. If we do get hotter weather we will adapt the itinerary as much as possible. There may be some cooler weather and some rain.

Flights

Group flights are with Easyjet from Gatwick to Agadir:

21st Dec	depart London Gatwick 07.10, arrive Agadir 11.05
28th Dec	depart Agadir 11.50, arrive Gatwick 15.40

It is also possible to fly from London Stansted with Ryanair: speak to us if you would like to explore this option.

Morocco local time is the same as in the UK.

Passport and visas

If you hold a British passport, you do not need a visa to travel to Morocco. If you do not have a UK passport, please check with your local consulate. Your passport will need to be valid **for at least six months** after your entry into Morocco.
